

Hundreds Of Local Teens March To Stop Slavery

Hundreds of Tri-state teens participated in the student-led "Unbound Movement" to raise awareness of modern day slavery.

Saturday evening the teens marched from Fountain Square to Sawyer Point in Downtown Cincinnati for the "Walk and Rock" event. The event ended a two-day Unbound Youth Prayer Gathering, the first student-led event in the United States, at Crossroads in Oakley.

The goal was to "inform, equip, and mobilize young people to fight modern-day slavery in all its forms," say organizers.

Throughout the two days, events featured multimedia, hands-on experiences of modern-day slavery and interactive prayer rooms covering topics including underage human sex trafficking, child slavery, child soldiers, and slavery in the U.S.
